MOURNING A HERO: AFSCME STATEMENT ON DCFS EMPLOYEE

DEIDRE SILAS

As most of you have heard by now DCFS investigator Deidre Silas, a member of AFSCME Local 805, was murdered while responding to a report of children in danger in the town of Thayer, outside Springfield on January 4, 2022. Below is a statement on this tragic loss from AFSCME Council 31 Executive Director Roberta Lynch:

"We are heartbroken at the loss of Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) investigator and AFSCME member Deidre Silas of Springfield, murdered Tuesday while responding to a report of children in danger.

"The perpetrator of this unspeakable crime must be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.


"Deidre dedicated her career to helping young people. Prior to joining DCFS in August 2021 she worked in behavioral health and for more than seven years with the Department of Juvenile Justice where she was a union steward.

"This tragedy is a stark reminder that frontline DCFS employees like Deidre do demanding, dangerous and essential jobs every day, often despite inadequate resources and tremendous stress.

"AFSCME will carefully study the facts of this incident as they emerge and press for any necessary changes to DCFS operations. One death in the line of service is too many.

"Our union is providing support to Deidre's coworkers to help them process this trauma and aid their grieving. The hearts and thoughts of every AFSCME member are with Deidre's loved ones, especially her children, in the wake of their profound and senseless loss. In her name we rededicate ourselves to our vigilant advocacy to improve workplace safety for all."

State Representative Dave Vella reached out to our local and asked to meet with us to discuss worker safety. I would like to thank, Laurie Scudder, Tanya Burns, Jennifer Hawley, and Carissa Whaley, for taking time out of their much-needed day off on January 17th to meet with myself, AFSCME Council 31 Legislative Liaison Jeanne Cameron and Dave Vella. We had a great talk with a lot of outstanding ideas being presented.

APPLE STREUSEL CRUMBLE

Ingredients

- 3 large apples-Cortland or McIntosh
- 1/2 cup of sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

Topping

- 1/4 cup cold butter (4 tablespoons)
- 1/2 cup of flour
- 1/3 cup of sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon of nutmeg (optional)

Directions

Preheat to 350 degrees

Directions continued

Grease the bottom only of a small casserole dish. Peel and core the apples, slice and place in a bowl. Top with sugar, cinnamon and vanilla, toss to coat. Set aside while preparing topping.

Make the streusel by cutting the cold butter into a bowl, adding flour, sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg (if you so choose to use). Rub through your fingers until the streusel is coarse, sandy/pebbly texture.

Put the seasoned apples into the pan, top generously with the streusel, and bake at 350 degrees about 30 minutes, or until the streusel is golden brown and the apple is starting to bubble up through the topping.
